## BJP fields Hardik Patel from Viramgam, Ravindra Jadeja's wife from Jamnagar North



Ahmedabad : The BJP released on Thursday its first list of 160 candidates for the Gujarat assembly polls, following a meeting of the party's central election committee at its headquarters in New Delhi on Wednesday. Chief minister Bhupendra Patel will contest the election from Ghatodiya constituency while home minister Harsh Sanghani has been fielded from Majura seat.

Patidar leader Hardik Patel will contest the elections from Viramgam constituency while cricketer Ravindra Jadeja's wife Rivaba has got a ticket from Jamnagar North.

Of the 160, 84 candidates are for the first phase on December 1 when 89 seats will go to the polls, and 76 for the second on December 5 when remaining 93 seats are going to the polls.

There are 14 female, 13 SC and 24 ST candidates in the list of 160 announced on the day. Union minister Bhupendra Yadav said the list includes 69 sitting MLAs, while 38 incumbents have been replaced with new faces.

It is to be noted that former Gujarat CM Vijay Rupani, former deputy CM Nitin Patel, former senior ministers Bhupendrasinh Jadasama and Pradipsinh Jadeja, senior leaders PC Faldru, Saurabh Patel and Kaushik Patel have opted out of the fray this time, saying they will work for the party organisation. They all said

that 'others' should be given a chance.

The assembly elections in Gujarat will be held in two phases. The last date for filing nominations for the first phase of elections is November 14 while that for the second phase is November 17.

Union ministers Bhupendra Yadav and Mansukh Mandavaya were joined by Gujarat BJP president CR Patel at a press conference in New Delhi where Yadav named the candidates selected by the party.

On Wednesday, the election committee, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, decided the names of the party candidates. The meeting was attended by Union home minister Amit Shah, Gujarat

## AMC, panchayats frantically hunt for wheelchairs

AHMEDABAD: Of late, many officials of the AMC and of some district panchayats from western Ahmedabad are inquiring about wheelchairs.

The reason is that the Election Commission of India has directed that every polling station have one wheelchair and an attendant to assist those with disabilities. There are 21 assembly seats in Ahmedabad of which 16 are located in urban areas and five in rural areas. The city has 5,599 polling stations of which

chief minister Patel, state BJP chief Patil, party national president JP Nadda, Maharashtra deputy chief minister Devendra Fadnis, Union minister Yadav and former Karnataka CM BS Yediyurappa among others. After the meeting, Shah held a separate meeting with the Gujarat CM and state BJP chief.

The BJP is hopeful of maintaining its uninterrupted winning streak in the state assembly polls since 1995 even as in the 2017 assembly elections, it had obtained a simple majority, despite an increase in vote share. It had won 99 seats, a decrease of 16 seats from the previous 2012 elections. The vote share and number of seats of the Congress, however, increased from the previous election. It had won 77 seats, again 16 more from 2012. This was the highest number of seats won by the Congress since the 1985 election, when it had won 149 seat.

The entry of the Aam Aadmi Party has added an extra dimension to the state's traditional bipolar elections this time, with the BJP's main challenger Congress hit by a fresh round of desertion by its leaders.

## Madhu Shrivastava 'jokes' he wants his wife to contest polls



VADODARA: Six-time BJP MLA Madhu Shrivastava was in limelight again for the wrong reasons on Wednesday when he stated that his wife will contest elections. He later claimed that he was only joking and BJP did not believe in promoting relatives.

Uncertainty prevailed over the BJP ticket for Shrivastava on the Waghodiya seat. He, however, has been saying repeatedly that he was confident that the party will choose him as a candidate.

On Wednesday, Shrivastava told media persons that the party will take a call regarding his ticket. He added that he was not very keen to contest the polls this time and wished that his wife

did so. When asked if the party would give a ticket to his wife, Shrivastava said that as a husband he was saying that she would contest and that he could give her a ticket. Later, however, the motormouth leader realized his goof and claimed that it was a slip of tongue. He tried to damage control claiming it was said in a lighter vein and that BJP did not believe in promoting relatives. Waghodiya has emerged as a seat that the BJP is finding difficult to decide on as Shrivastava is a strong candidate while another suspended BJP member Dharmendrasinh Waghela who had contested as an independent in 2017 may contest the polls again.

## Parties ignore hoarding rules, Ahmedabad civic body anxious

Ahmedabad : Most big political parties like the BJP and the Congress have rented hoarding spaces from the city civic body to put up advertisements across the city.

According to the rules, before the Model Code of Conduct comes into force, the parties have to declare details such as the number of hoardings, locations, and expenditure with the district collectors' offices.

The Ahmedabad district collector's office has set up a

single-window clearance system to accept these declarations. However, none of the major parties followed the rules though the MCC has been enforced. The collector's office has now demanded these details from the AMC.

Sources said the civic body gives contracts to private agencies to rent out the space. With the collector's office threatening to take action, AMC officials had to personally meet party officials to make them upload their declarations, sources said.

## Gujarat assembly polls: Defections deal a blow to fractured Congress



Ahmedabad: With less than a month to go for the assembly poll, a beleaguered Gujarat Congress is staring at further disintegration with its elected leaders making a hurried exit from the party to join the BJP. A day after tribal strongman and 10-time MLA From Chhota Udepur, Mohansinh Rathwa joined BJP, Talala legislator Bhagwan Barad also donned saffron while Jhalod MLA Bhavesh Katara submitted his resignation to assembly speaker Dr Nima Acharya.

Barad's exit is significant as the BJP, in the 2017 poll, had failed to win even a single seat in Gir-Somnath district under which his constituency falls. The district has four assembly segments.

Barad, also known as Bhagabhai, claimed he was joining the BJP without the precondition of a BJP ticket. Patidar Congress MLA Niranjan Patel is also said to be "keeping his options open".

Though Congress in Gujarat is no stranger to pre-poll defections, losing its MLAs matters this time as an aggressive Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) threatens to slice through its vote share in a triangular contest.

Sources said that over half a dozen MLAs are said to be seriously considering jumpshipping and joining the BJP. The pre-election defections were being anticipated after seven Congress MLAs had crossed over to BJP nominee

Droupadi Murmu in the Presidential election held in July.

In 2017, the Congress put up its best-ever electoral show by winning 77 seats, the highest since 1990 when the party's downward slide began. However, switching over to the BJP turned out to be a damp squib for many leaders who said so expecting a better political future. Out of the 19 Congress MLAs who have joined the BJP, seven have been rewarded with ministerial berths with some even getting cabinet ranks.

In all, 14 MLAs had quit before the Rajya Sabha election when veteran Ahmed Patel just managed to scrape through in a cliffhanger of a finish. Most Congress turncoats have a considerable following among their communities, which was

evident when eight such MLAs won the bypolls on BJP tickets.

There was unease in the Congress before the 2019 Lok Sabha polls too when Alpesh Thakor, OBC leader and Congress MLA from Radhanpur, joined the BJP along with Bayad MLA Dhaval Jhala. Thakor, however, lost the by-election.

Patidar leader, Hardik Patel, who spearheaded a fierce Patidar reservation stir that had inflicted damage to the BJP in the 2017 poll, has also turned into a foot soldier of PM Narendra Modi after he quit the post of Congress working president in June.

State Congress spokesman Manish Doshi said, "Before every election, the BJP bribes our party's MLAs and gives them tickets. But the voters have shown them the door every time. Congress has always emerged stronger after the exit of such opportunists."

Yamal Vyas, the state BJP spokesperson said, "The disengagement among Gujarat Congress leaders and workers is at its peak due to poor central and state leadership. They are impressed by the leadership of PM Modi and Amit Shah."

## Liquor worth 60 lakh seized, three arrested

Vadodara: The Vadodara (rural) police have seized liquor worth Rs 60 lakh in two different operations that were conducted in Karjan and Manjusr areas on Tuesday night. The local crime branch (LCB) rural sleuths arrested three persons who were ferrying the liquor.

The police said that with assembly polls around the corner, liquor ferrying is expected to increase in the region. They have been patrolling the

highways and keeping an eye on suspicious vehicles. On Tuesday evening, the LCB got a tip-off that a container ferrying liquor will pass from Manjusr following which they caught a watch on the stretch and intercepted a vehicle. The cops questioned the driver who identified himself as Dharampal Gurjar, a resident of Rajasthan. Upon checking the vehicle, the police team found 13,080 bottles of liquor worth Rs 23 lakh.

## From power to poverty: These ex-MLAs in Gujarat have seen it all



Ahmedabad : The image of an MLA that conjures up in one's mind is that of an influential person swanning around in chauffeur-driven cars, drawing more than Rs 1 lakh in monthly salary and allowances, and has a dedicated staff at his beck and call. While it would sound improbable that a person who has been an MLA could be poor, there are at least a couple of former MLAs who have been living in abject penury.

Jethabhai Rathod, 85, a former MLA from Khedbrahma constituency in North Gujarat's Sabarkantha district, has a BPL (below poverty line) card. Another former MLA Virsinh Mohaniya, 91, lives in a kutcha house as he has never worked as a manual labourer in farms to feed his family.

Rathod had won the 1967 assembly election as a candidate of the Swatantra Party, which had bagged 66 seats in the poll. Rathod still lives in Tebda, his ancestral village in Sabarkantha's Poshina taluka. The village has a population of about 4,000 people.

"I had spent around Rs 30,000 provided by my friends and party members for my campaign. I did the campaigning on a bicycle," said Rathod, who lives in a 20-member joint family comprising two wives, and nine children and grandchildren.

When he got elected as an MLA, Rathod was

gifted eight pairs of kurtajamas by one C C Desai, who was the then district panchayat president. "Times have changed drastically. No big नेता visited my constituency for campaigning in 1967. We used to take roasted grams for people who attended my election rallies," said the former MLA. Commenting on the canvassing these days, he said, "Nowadays, the campaigns have gone high-tech, and candidates spend huge amounts of

money. In those days, the only agenda we had or the promise we made was to try and solve the water crisis," said Rathod. Before being elected an MLA, Rathod had contested the taluka panchayat poll in 1967, but lost by 195 votes.

Virsinh Mohaniya, 91, who is battling age-related health issues finds it difficult to walk now. For years after completing his term as Congress MLA from Limkheda seat, which he had won in 1975, he had to work as a manual labourer in the farms

because of his poor financial condition. The ex-MLA lives in a kutcha house

### Students aspiring to study abroad cheated

Surat: The police on Tuesday booked two accused in Singanore Dabholi police station for allegedly duping various people to a tune of total Rs 90 lakh by promising them admission in foreign educational institute. The accused had collected fees from the victims but failed to provide them admission or return the money.

Students aspiring to study abroad cheated cops booked Mehul Parakhya and Manoj Tejan for alleged criminal breach of trust based on a complaint lodged by a tuition class teacher, Kishore Pokal. In his complaint, Pokal alleged that the accused continued the alleged crime since October 2021. The accused duo offered people admission in Canadian educational institutes. They collected money to pay fees on behalf of the students and told the candidates that the fees had been paid through credit card.

## Footfalls at SOU hit 1 crore mark

Vadodara: In what could be a record for a tourism site in Gujarat, the footfall at the Statue of Unity (SOU) in Narmada district has surpassed the one crore mark in just four years of its unveiling.

SOU officials said that recently the number of tourists who visited the SOU crossed one crore and the numbers are expected to shoot up in the coming months.

"In such a short span, SOU has attracted such a large number of tourists and that too when the site was closed for several months due to the Covid-19

## Man held for stealing money through lost ATM card

AHMEDABAD : Cybercrime police on Tuesday arrested a man from Maninagar for allegedly stealing Rs 1 lakh from a Ghodasar man's lost ATM card in July. According to investigators, Amit Jain, 40, a resident of Namrata Apartments near Aaradhna School in Maninagar, has been trying his luck with lost and stolen ATM cards.

When police caught him, he was found with 81 ATM cards. It is not known how much money he withdrew using these ATM cards.

## Gujarat: NEET repeat! 45% took test again to better score



AHMEDABAD: Neel Patel scored 432 out of 720 in the Undergraduate National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (NEET-UG) 2021 but did not

take admission in medicine. He prepared once again for a year and appeared again in 2022 posting an impressive score of 648. By investing a

year, Patel not only got admission in the government medical college in Vadodara, one of the top medical colleges in the state but also saved lakhs in fees. "I took a drop as my NEET-UG score last year wasn't close to my year-round average. I had significant room for improvement. Last year, I was getting admission in management quota which means I had to pay about Rs 75 lakh to Rs 90 lakh in fees," Patel said and added that he didn't want to burden his parents with hefty fees that private colleges demanded. Patel said now that he has got admission in a government
